
THINGS TO SEE AND DO

- 1 Visit historic Ravensthorpe
- 2 Watch the whales at Point Ann
- 3 Spot the Wallabies at dawn or dusk (anywhere)
- 4 Visit historic Qualup Homestead
- 5 See the soldier settlement town Jerramungup
- 6 Visit John Dunn's grave
- 7 Have a kiss at the Meridian time line
- 8 Take a tinny out on the estuary at Bremer Bay
- 9 Explore Ravensthorpe Range in the Wildflower season
- 10 Take a kayak out on Hamersley Inlet
- 11 Feel the exhilaration of climbing East Mt Barren
- 12 Fish off Hopetoun Jetty at Sunset
- 13 See Royal Hakea in the Fitzgerald River National Park
- 14 Enjoy spectacular coastal scenery from the East Mt Barren Lookout
- 15 Stroll on pristine beaches
- 16 The beginning of the Rabbit Proof Fence
- 17 Swim and snorkel in the sparkling waters of the Southern Ocean Drive lagoons

Don't risk being the next victim!
Always watch the ocean and stay
well clear of sea level and cliff edges.

Check the distance

Please check the scale on the map and plan your travel time carefully. Distances are greater than they appear. Most of the roads in the park are unsealed and conditions vary.

The estimates below give the minimum travel time under ideal conditions. Expect to take longer.

Devils Creek Road to Point Ann - 50 mins for 66km
Quiss Road and Pabelup Drive to Point Ann - 60 mins for 64km Hamersley Drive To East Mt Barren from the north - 55 mins for 57km.

Restricted Area

To prevent the spread of dieback on the peaks, Woolbernup Hill, Narpulungup and Quyne-Dillun-Up are closed to walkers from the 150m contour line upwards.
